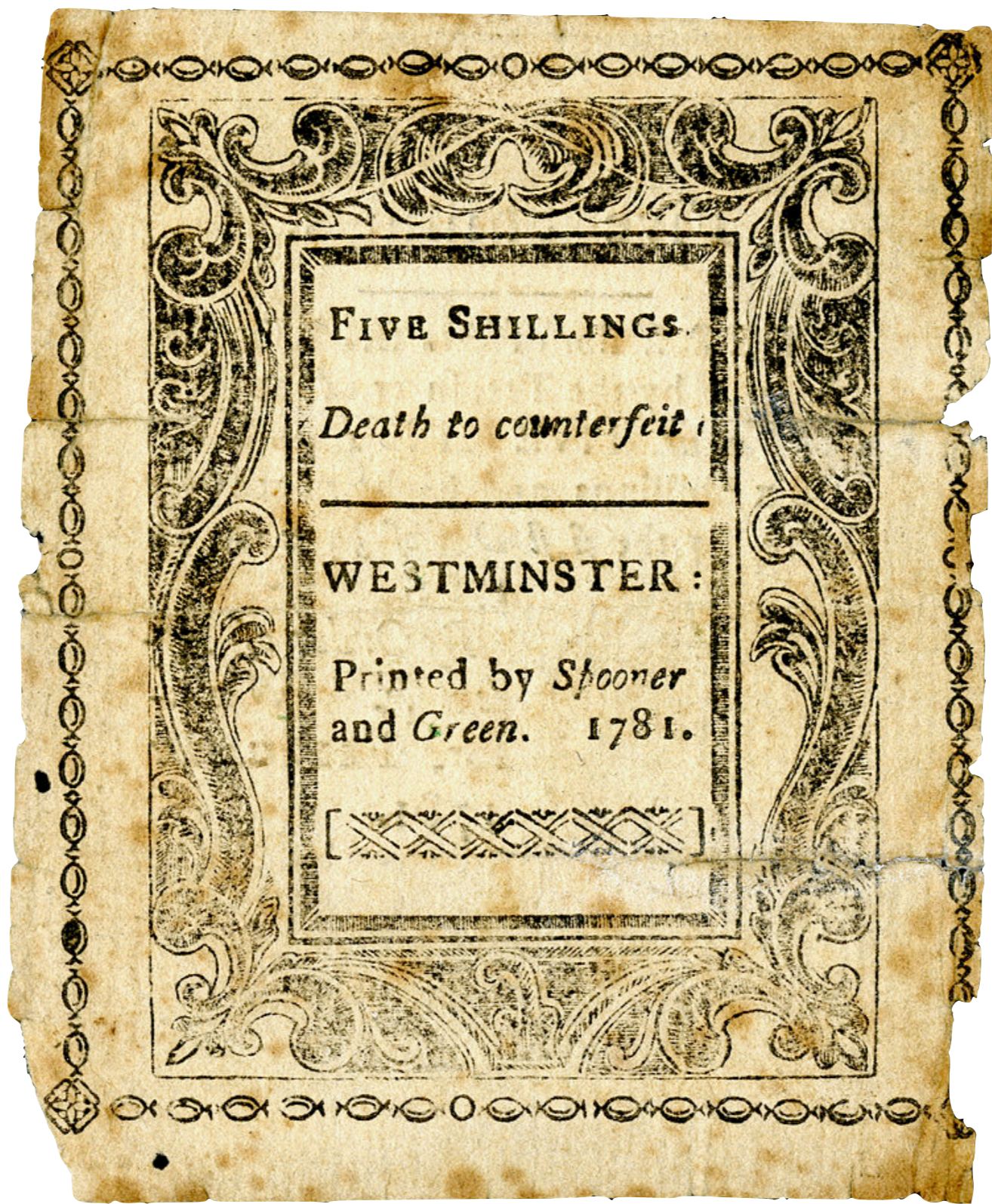
Vermont 1 Shilling Note

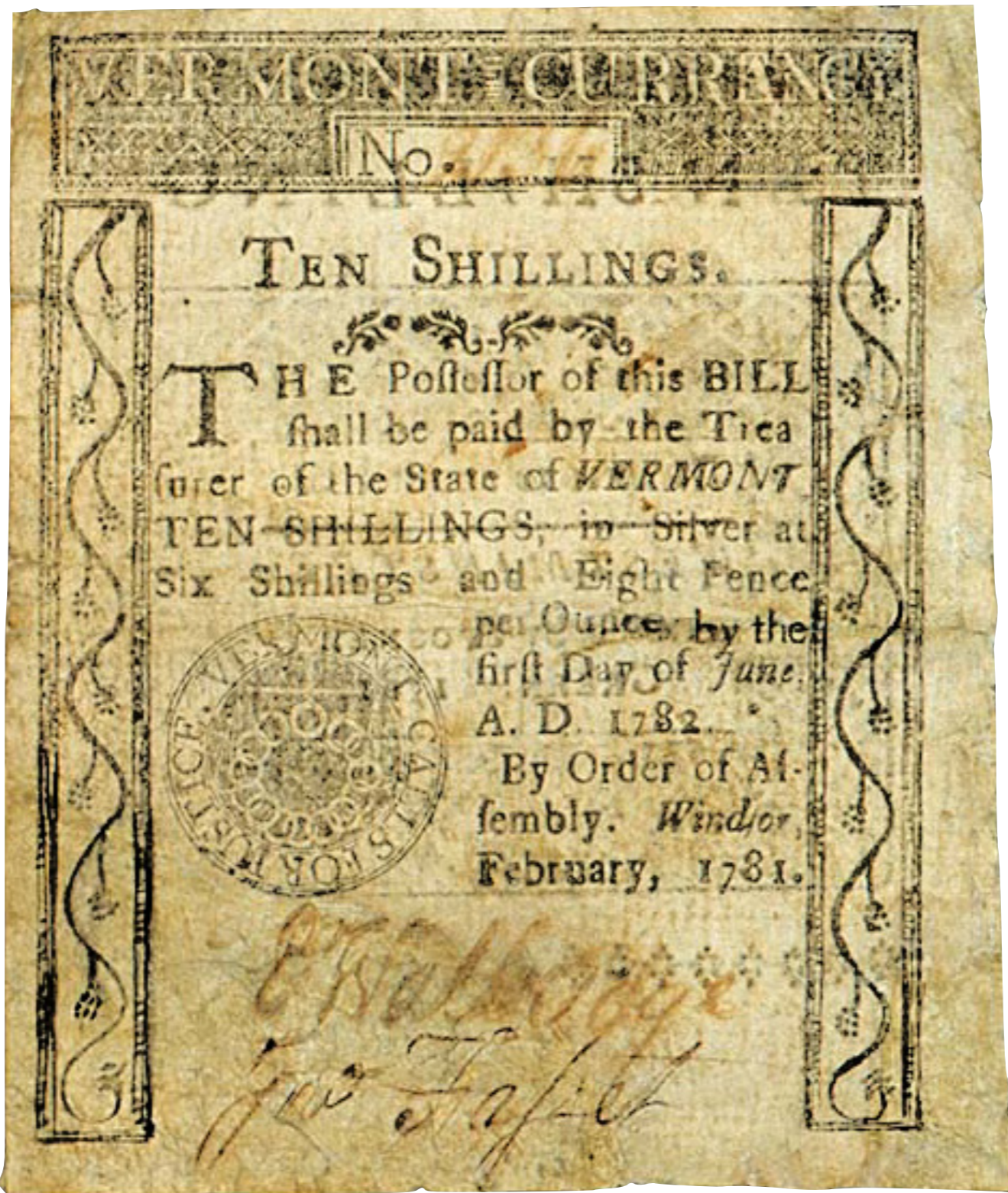
Vermont 1 Shilling Note

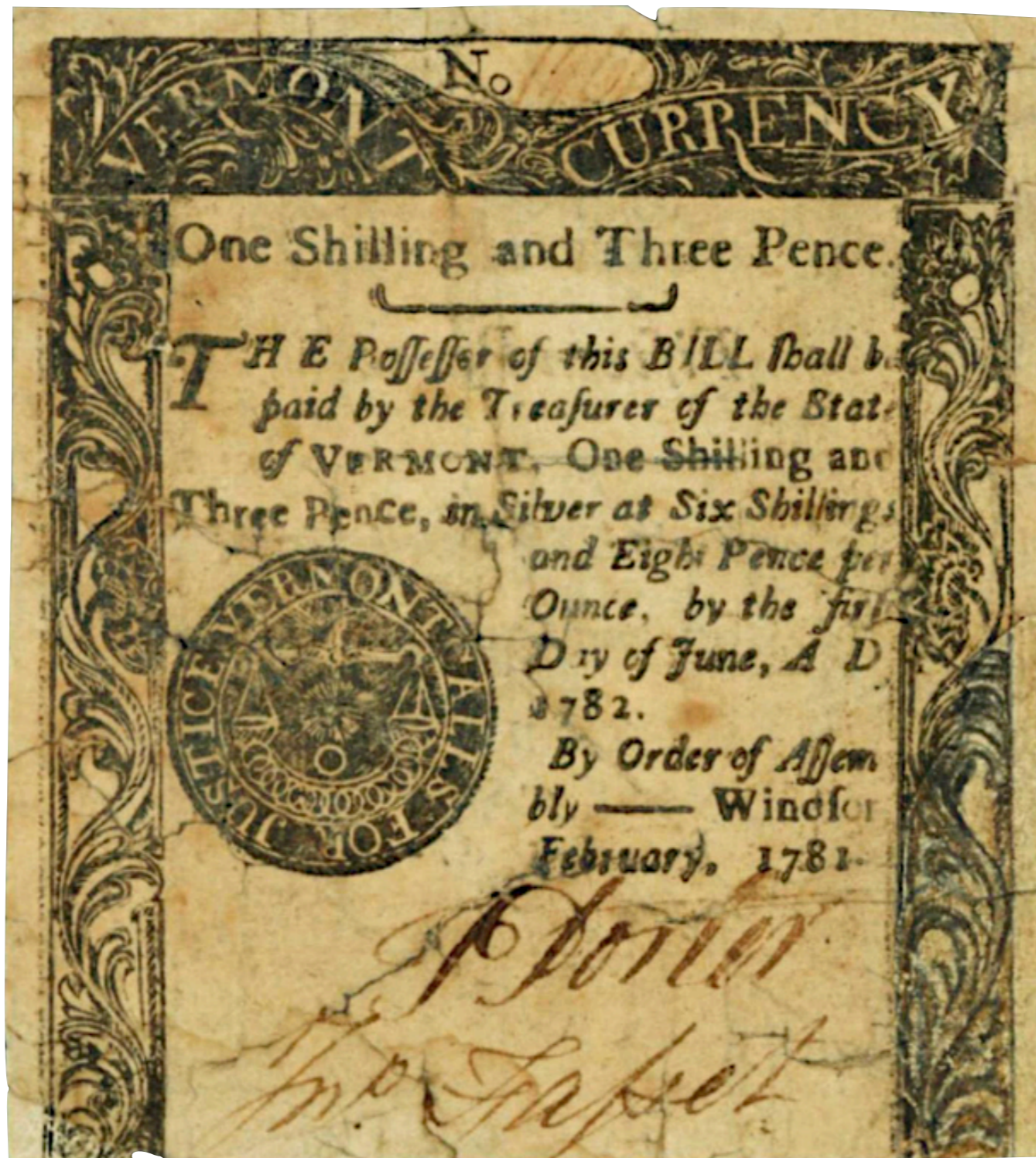

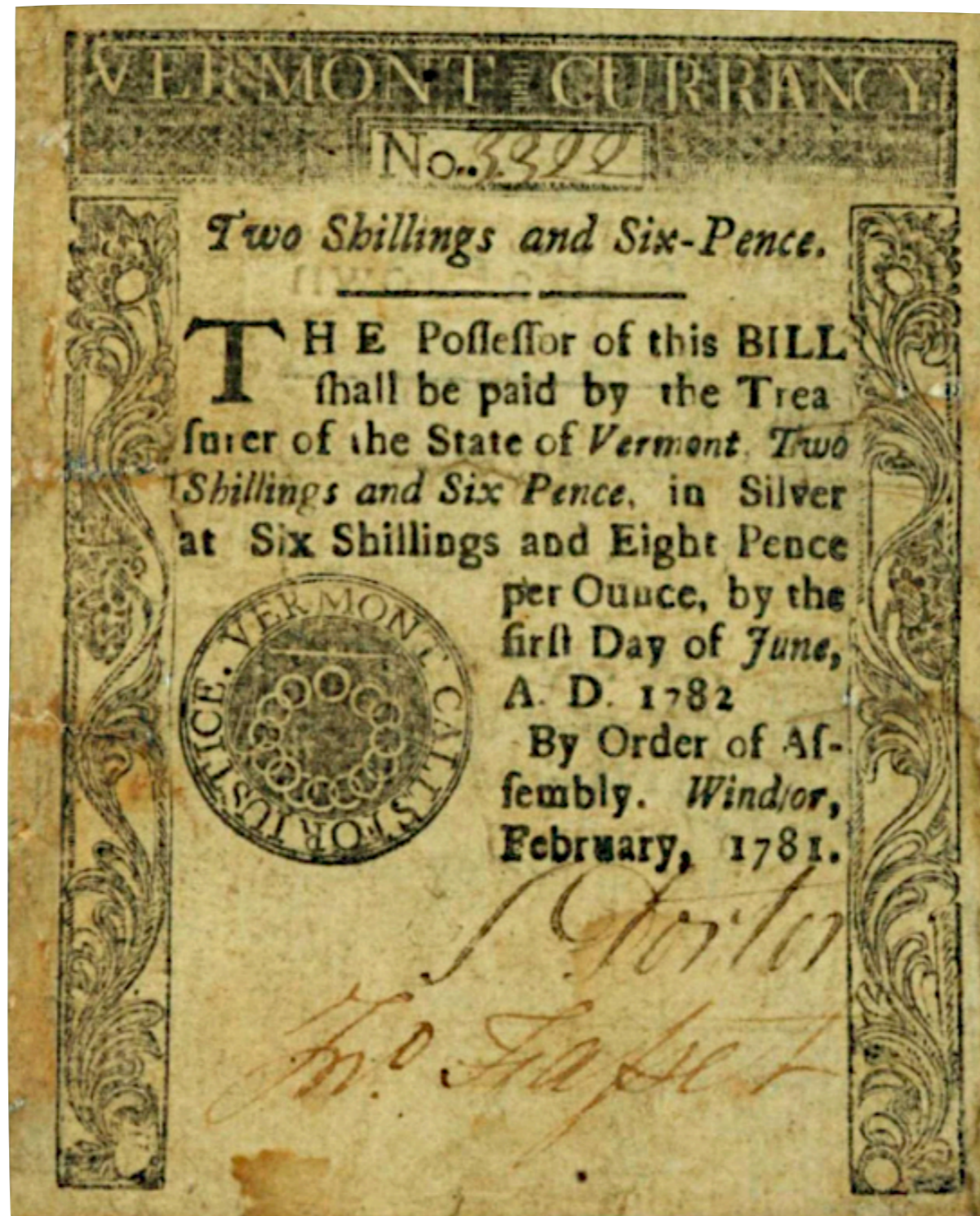

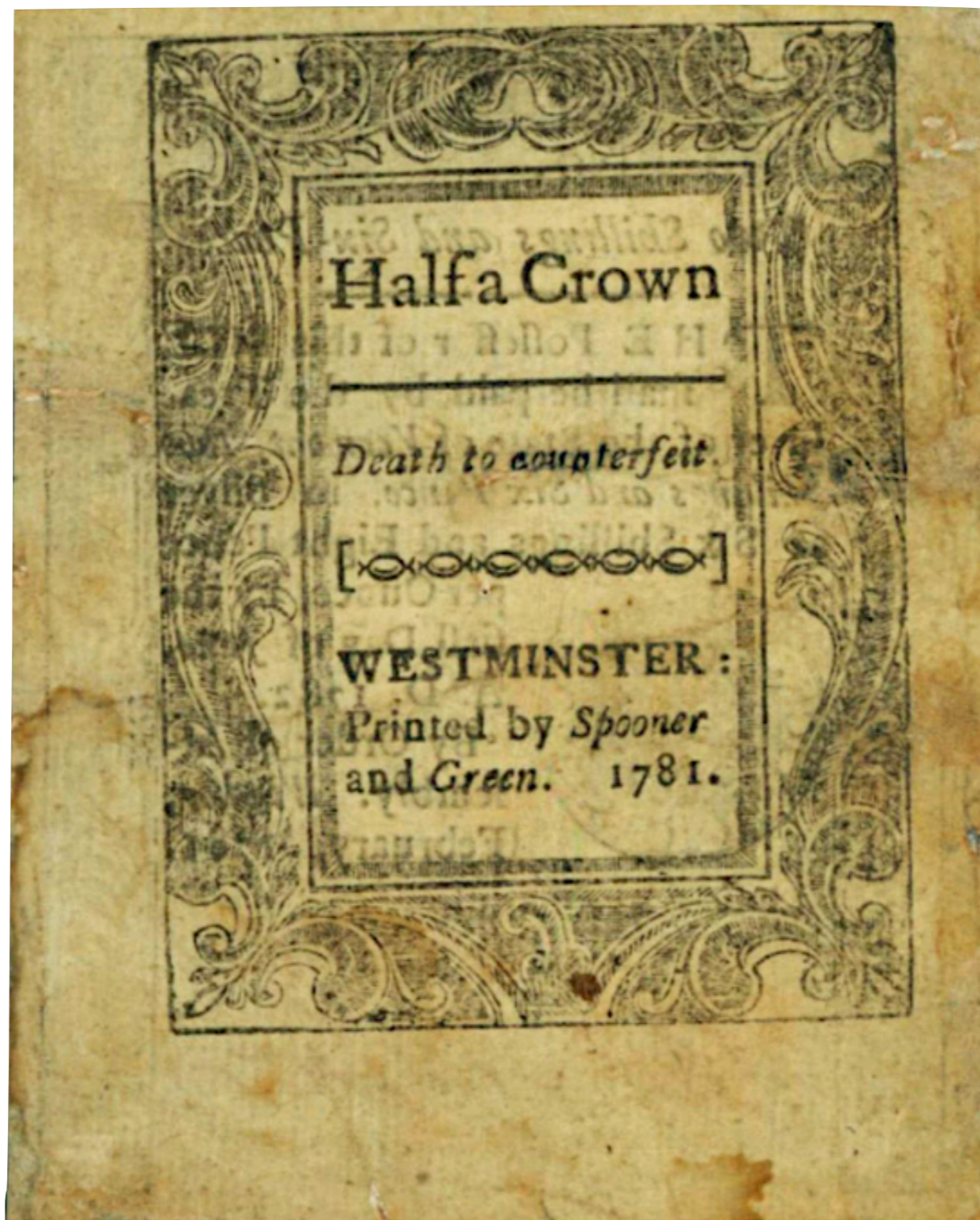
Vermont 1 Shilling 3 Pence Note

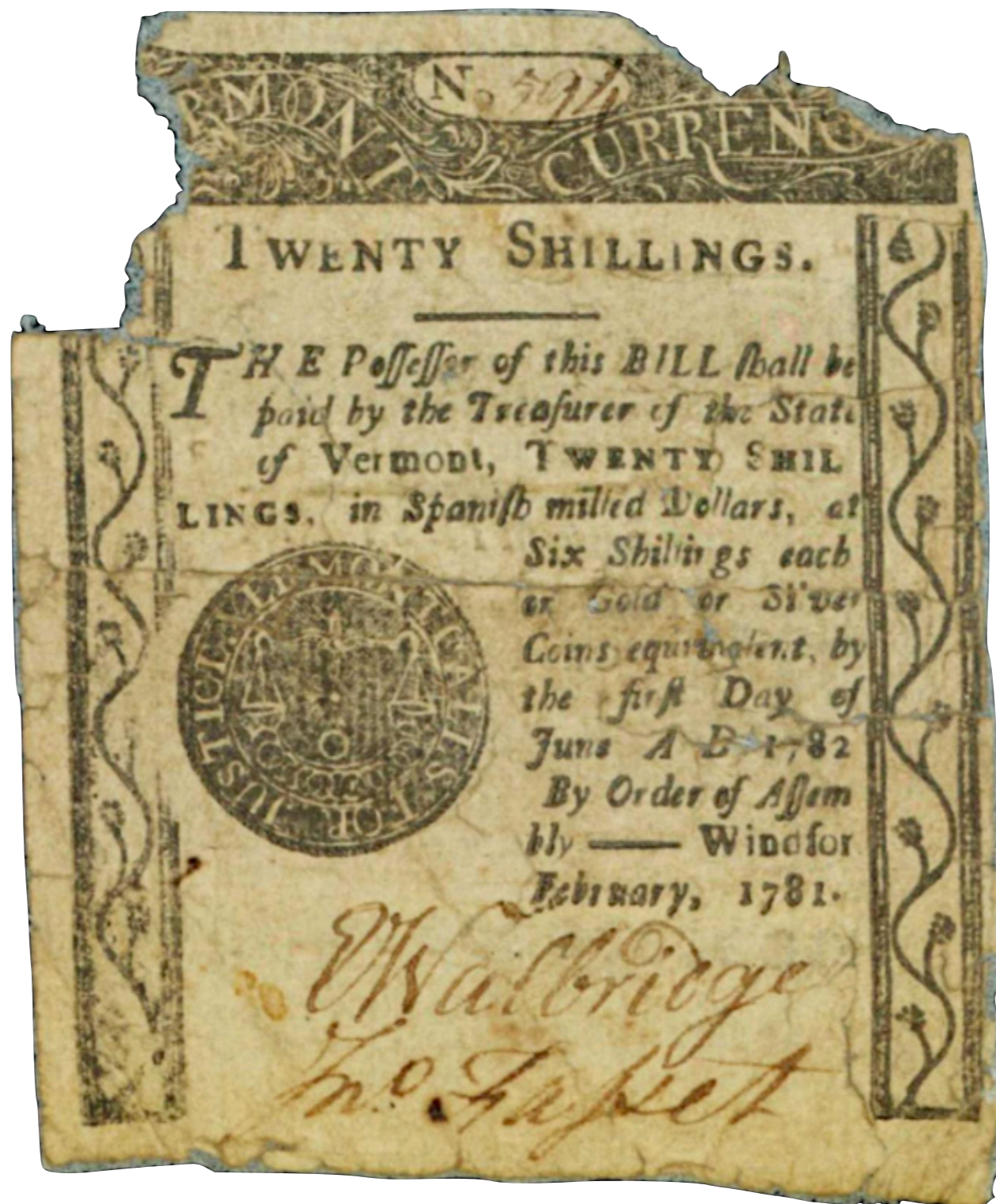
Vermont 1 Shilling 3 Pence Note
