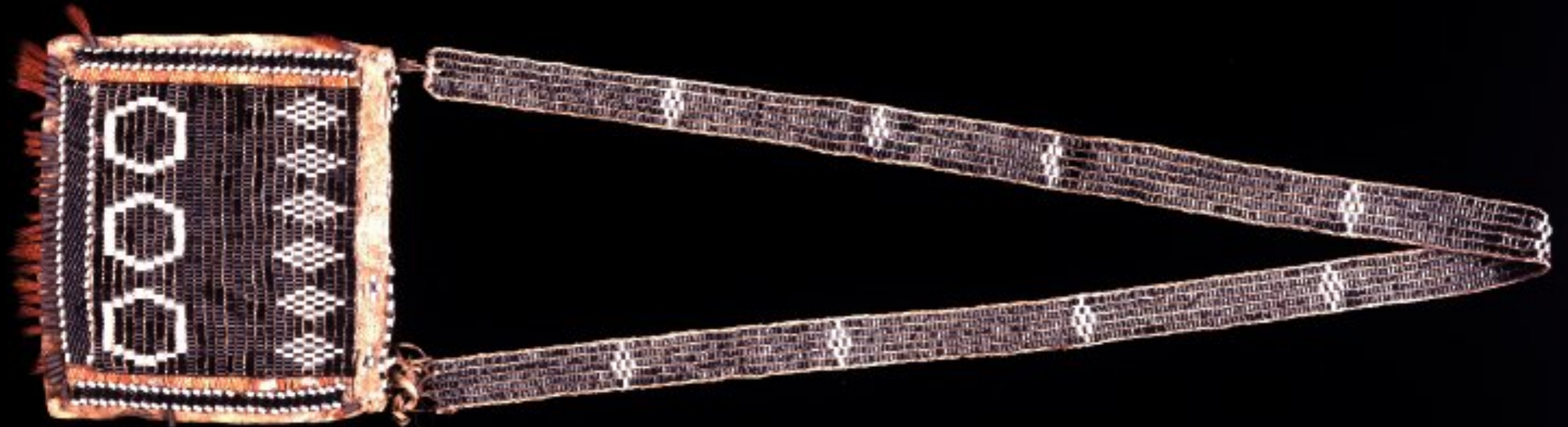

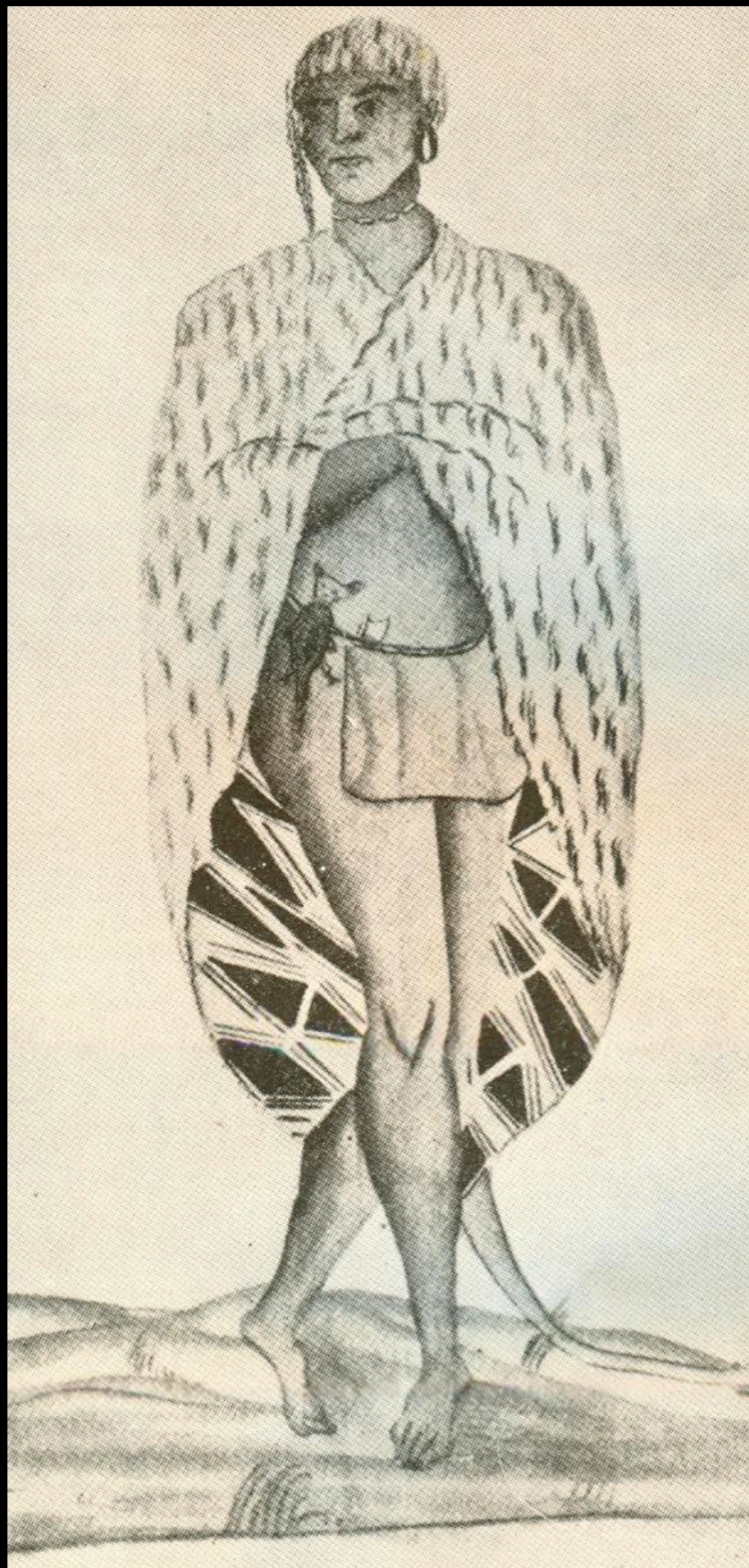

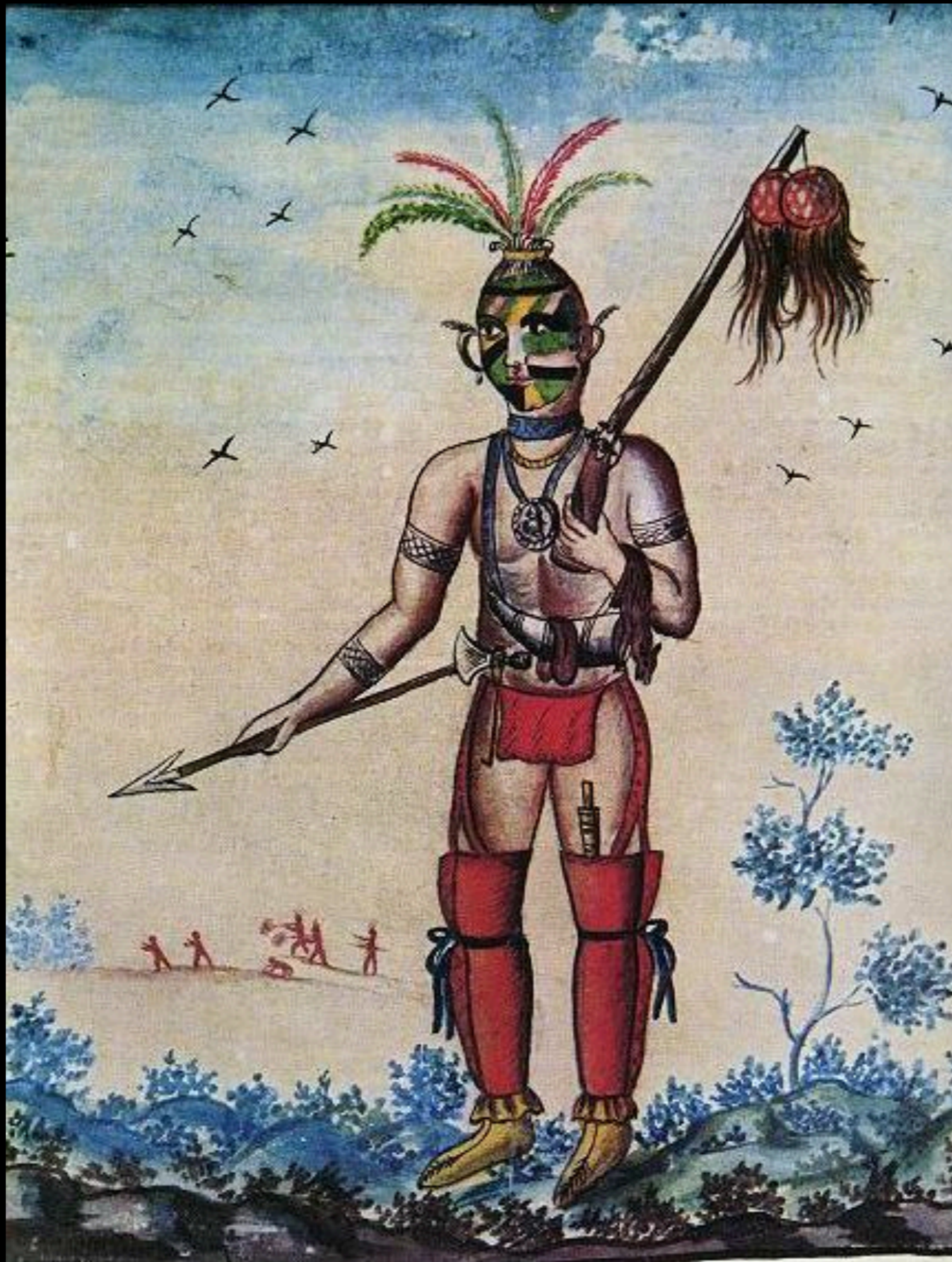
Lapowinska Delaware of the Leni-Lenape

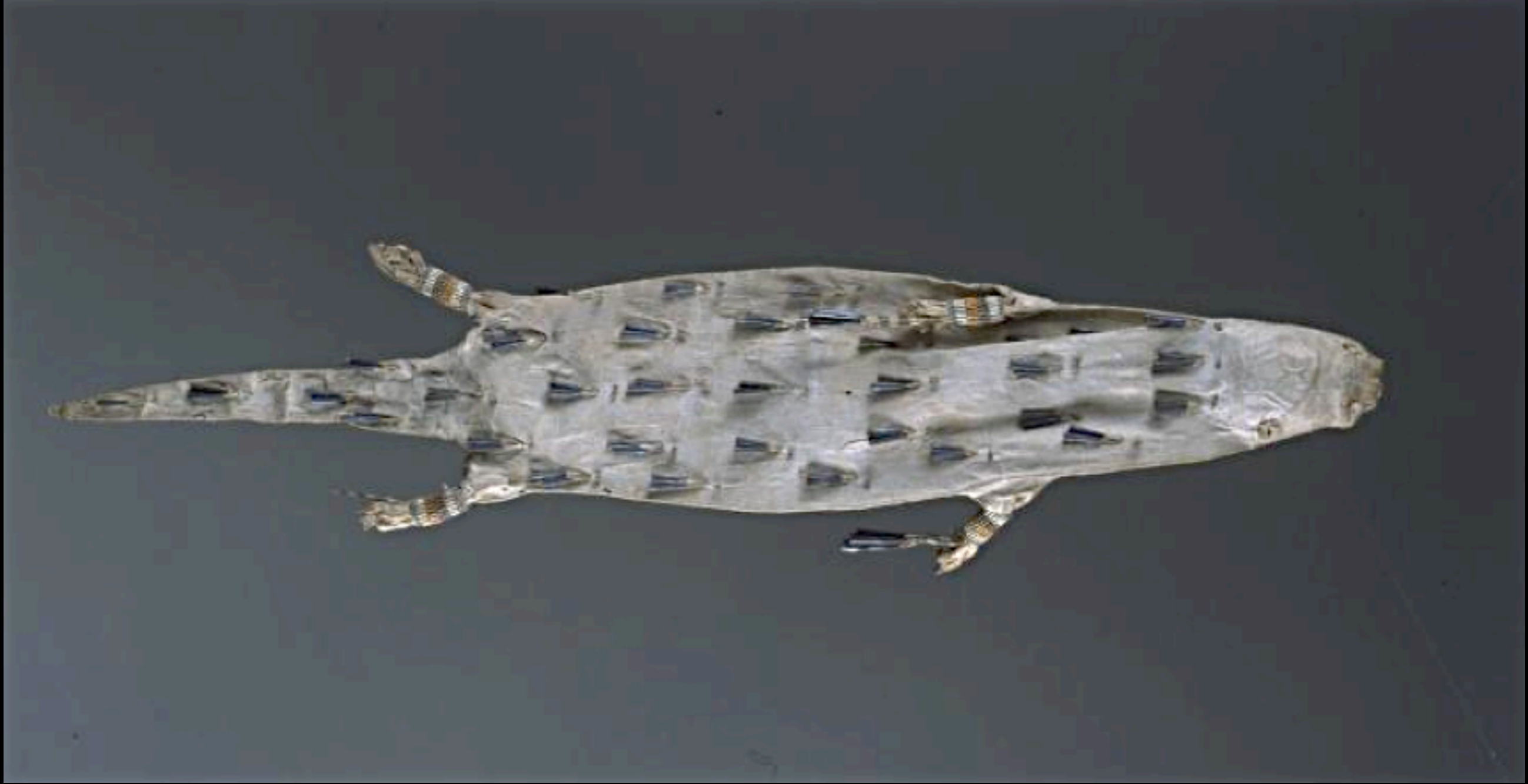
