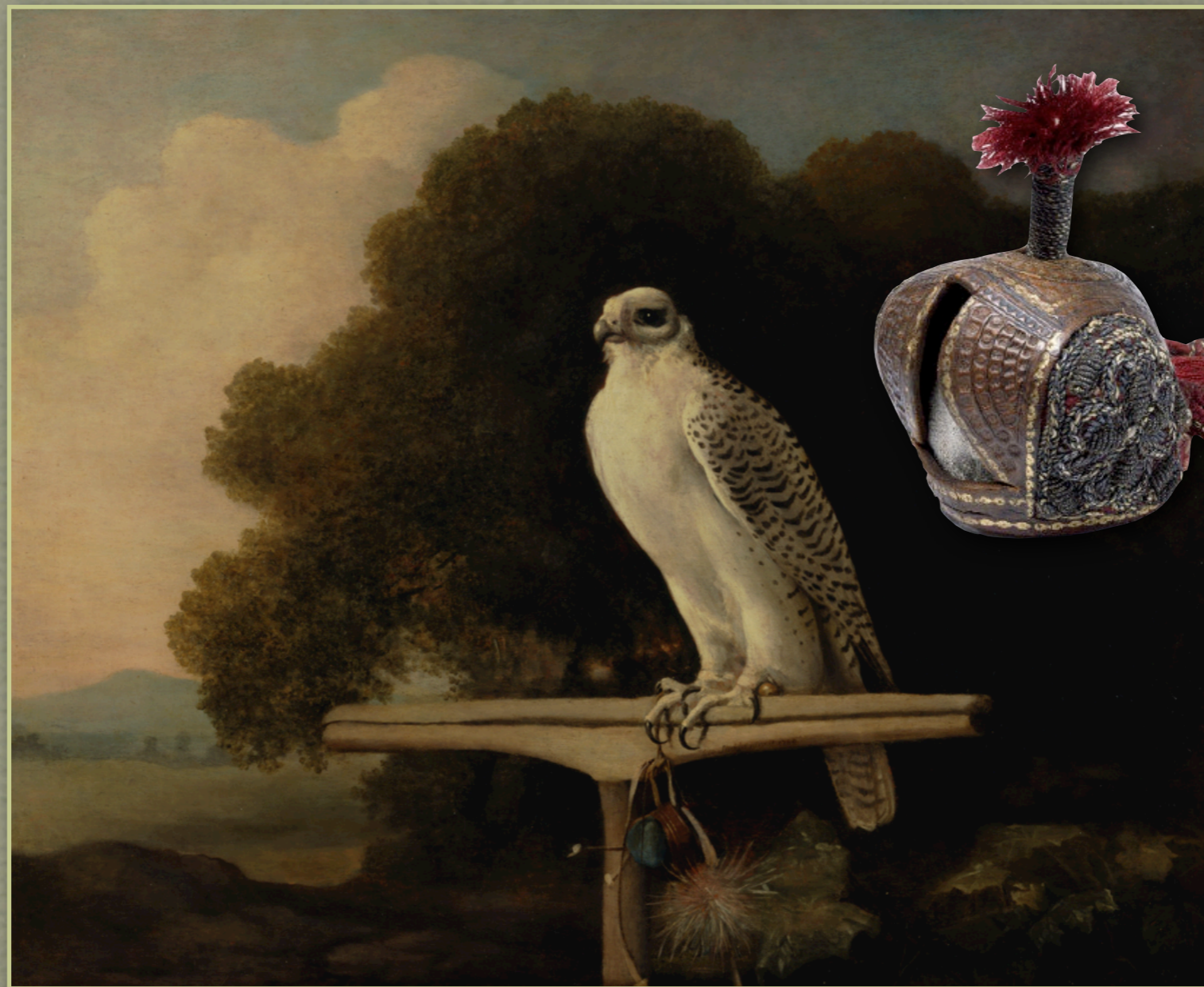

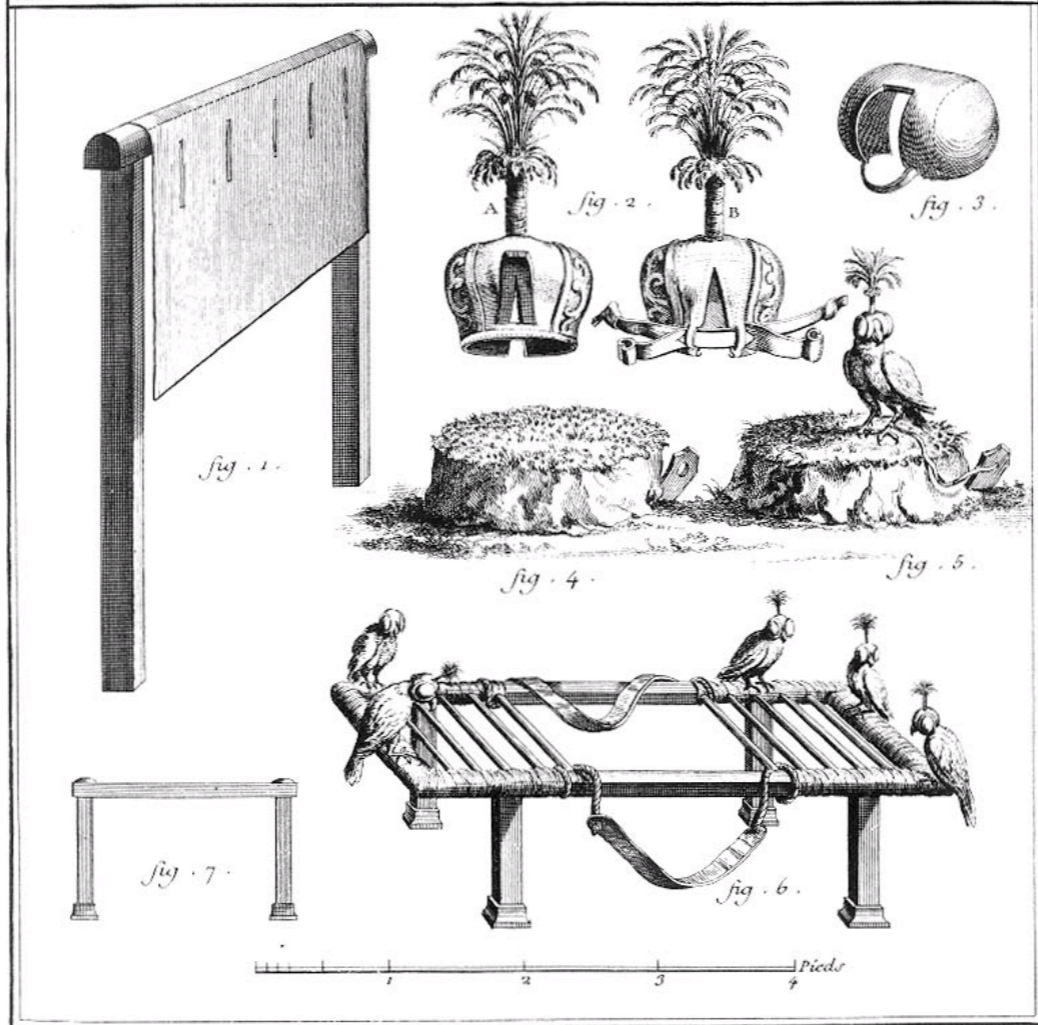
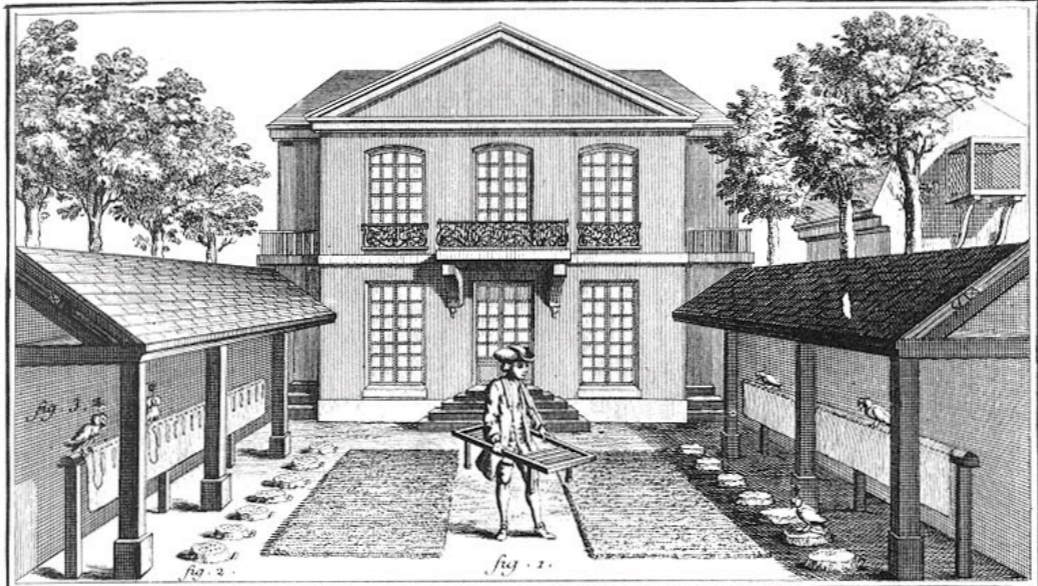

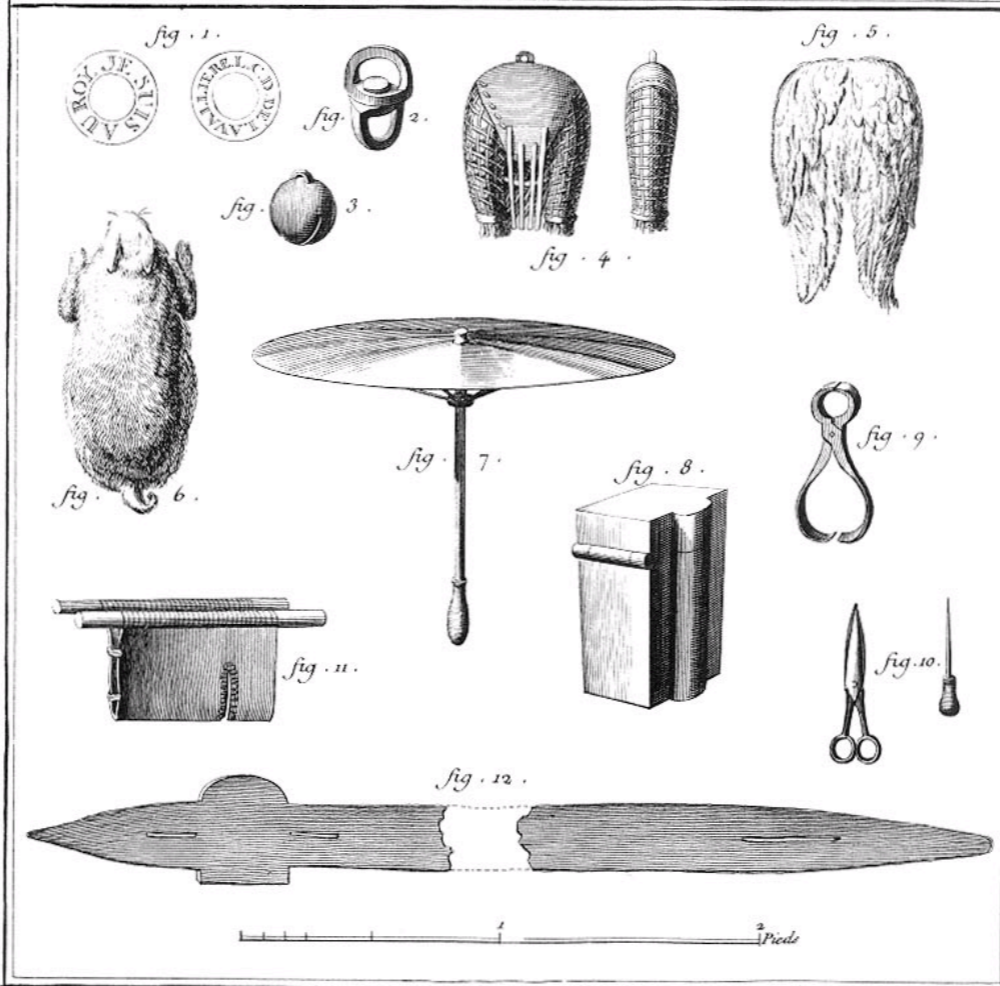
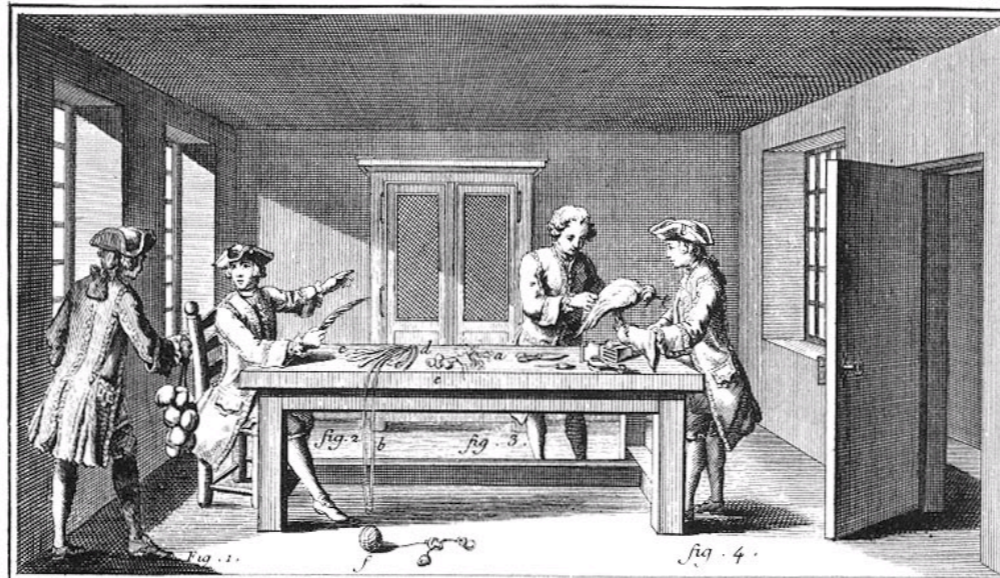


Gamepiece with a Dead Heron ("Falconer's Bag")

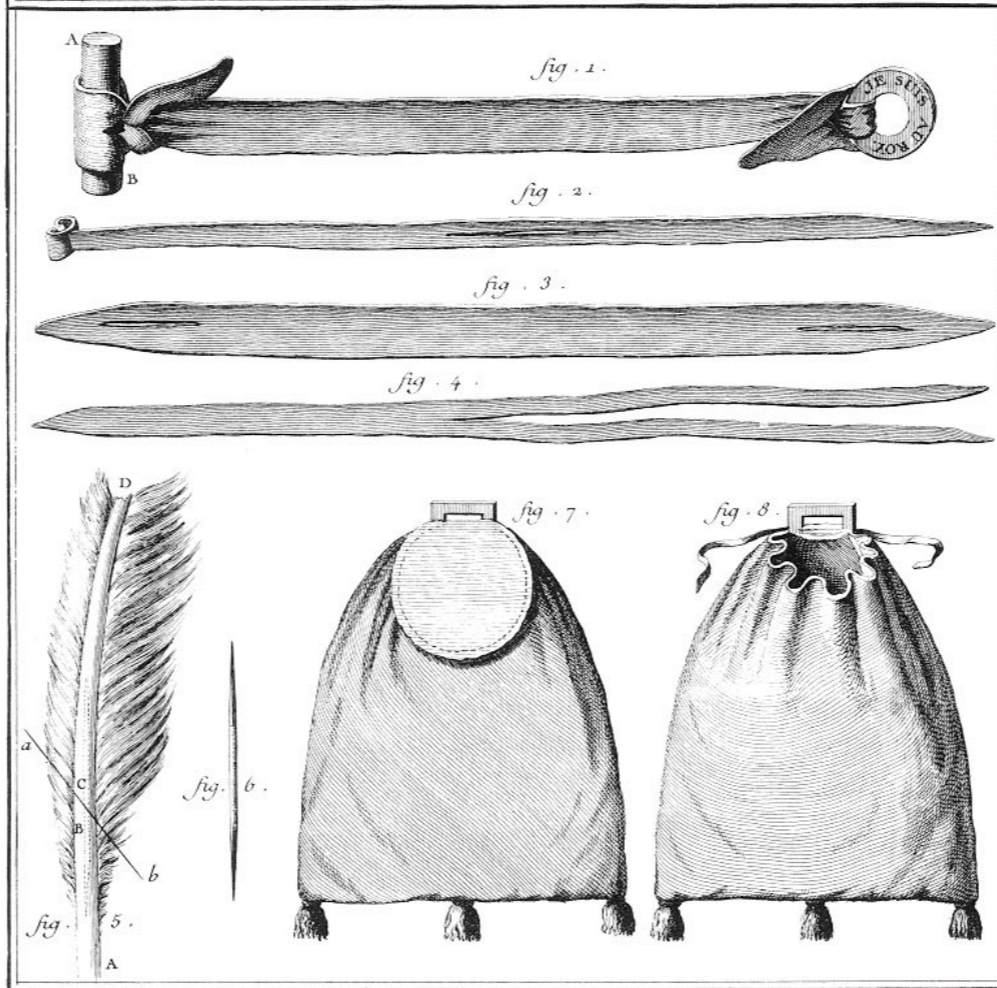
